Aquila¹ Chase (c1619-1670) and Ann (Wheeler) Chase (1621-1687)

On 29 Sep 1646, while still living in Hampton, Aquila Chase ran afoul of the law, when he, his wife, and his brother-in-law Daniel Wheeler were accused of gathering peas on the Sabbath. The authorities were delayed in prosecuting the Chases, for they had decamped for Newbury, but they did catch up with the miscreants a year and a half later. When they appeared in court for the offense on 28 Mar 1648 they beat the rap with nothing more than an admonishment. [Smith, Ancestry of Samuel Blanchard Ordway, 166, citing Essex Co. Quarterly Court Records 1:55:1 and 1:139]

AQUILA¹ CHASE was born in England about 1619.¹ His ancestry is not known.²

The first appearance of Aquila Chase in the New England records is Hampton, N. H. in June, 1640, when he and his brother Thomas received grants of house lots.³

ANN² WHEELER (JOHN¹) was baptized at St. Edmund's church, Salisbury, Wiltshire, England on 13 May 1621.⁴ She came to Massachusetts with her parents about 1639.

Aquila Chase married Ann Wheeler about 1644.⁵

In 1646, the town of Newbury, Mass. granted Aquila Chase a four-acre house lot and a six-acre planting lot, plus six acres of marsh, "on condition that he doe goe to sea and do service in the towne with a boate for four years."⁶

Aquila and Ann Chase lived the rest of their lives in Newbury. Aquila Chase signed the Robert Pike petition in May 1654 (see the discussion of this controversy in the sketch on John² Bailey, *supra.*)⁷

Aquila Chase of Newbury made his will on 10 Dec 1670. He mentions his wife Ann, daughters Ann Chase, Priscilla Chase, Sarah Chase, Ann Chase, Priscilla Chase, Ruth Chase; sons Thomas Chase (not yet 21), Aquila Chase (eldest son), John Chase, Daniel Chase, and Moses Chase, and "sonn in law Charles."⁸

Aquila Chase died in Newbury later that same month.⁹ His inventory was taken 21 Jan 1670[/71] by Edmund Woodman and John Bayley and totaled £336.14s.3d.¹⁰ His will was proved on 28 Mar 1671.¹¹

After Aquila's death, on 14 Jun 1672 in Newbury, Ann Chase married Daniel Mussiloway of Newbury, a man almost 20 years her junior.¹² Ann (Wheeler) (Chase) Mussiloway died on 21 Apr 1687.¹³

Aquila and Ann (Wheeler) Chase had the following children, all except Sarah born in Newbury:

Chase Family

- i. **Sarah Chase**, probably born in Hampton about 1645.¹⁴ She married Curmac ("Charles") Annis on 15 May 1666 in Newbury.¹⁵ She died between 12 Nov 1718, when she made her will, and 3 Jun 1726 when her daughters submitted a petition to the Essex Co. Probate Court.¹⁶
- ii. **Ann Chase**, born about 4 Jul 1647.¹⁷ She had a son, John Allen, born out of wedlock on 23 Nov 1669 or 23 Dec 1669, and she accused John² Allen, son of [William and Ann \(Goodale\) Allen](#), of being the father and of having raped her:

The testimony of Elinor Bailey, midwife of Newbury, she being at the labor of Ann Chase ... heard her say that living with Henry Wheeler in Salisbury as a servant she went from the house of her master to lodge at the house of Richard Hubberd, and left this man John Allen in her master's house, and she knew nothing of his coming from thence until he met her by the way ... and suddenly laid hands upon her. This she constantly affirmed, being in labor and extremity about 6 days and in appearance at the point of death. "I often told her that it was likely her pains continued the longer because she had not spoken the truth; her constant answer was that if she died for it, she had spoken the truth and nothing else."¹⁸

Ann Chase married Thomas Barber in Newbury on 27 Apr 1671.¹⁹ Both Thomas and Ann were living in Suffield, Conn. in 1690.²⁰
- iii. **Priscilla Chase**, born on 14 Mar 1648.²¹ She married Abel Merrill in Newbury on 10 Feb 1670.²² Abel Merrill was the son of NATHANIEL and SUSANNAH MERRILL, *q. v.*
- iv. **Mary Chase**, born on 3 Feb 1650.²³ She married John Stevens in Newbury 9 Mar 1669.²⁴ He was born in Newbury on 19 Nov 1650, the son of William and Elizabeth (Bitfield) Stevens.²⁵ His will, which mentions his wife Mary, was written 15 Jan 1724/25 and proved 6 Apr 1725.²⁶
- v. **Aquila Chase**, born on 26 or 27 Sep 1652.²⁷ He married Esther Bond about 1673.²⁸ She was born in Newbury on 3 Sep 1655, the daughter of John and Esther (Blakely) Bond.²⁹ Aquila died in Newbury on 29 Jul 1720.³⁰ Esther was living on 16 Jan 1722/23.³¹
- vi. **Thomas Chase**, born on 25 Jul 1654.³² He married (1) Rebecca Follinsby, daughter of Thomas and Mary (_____) Follinsby, on 22 Nov 1677 in Newbury.³³ She died in Newbury on 27 Dec 1711.³⁴ Thomas married (2) Elizabeth _____, likely Elizabeth (Woodhead) Moores, on 2 Aug 1714 in Newbury.³⁵ She was born in Chelmsford, Mass. on 28 Dec 1674, the daughter of William and Mary (Browne) Woodhead,³⁶ and was the widow of Jonathan Moores.³⁷ Thomas wrote his will on 3 Aug 1732 and it was proved on 25 Feb 1733/43.³⁸ Elizabeth was living when the will was proved.³⁹
- vii. **John Chase**, born on 2 Nov 1655.⁴⁰ He married (1) Elizabeth Bingley, in Newbury on 23 May 1677.⁴¹ She was born in Newbury on 24 Jun 1660, the daughter of William and Elizabeth (Preston) Bingley.⁴² Elizabeth died before 21 Dec 1687, the date that John married (2) in Salisbury Lydia Challis.⁴³ Lydia was born in Salisbury on 31 May 1665 or 1666, the daughter of Philip and Mary (Sargent) Challis,⁴⁴ and she was living in 1736.⁴⁵ John Chase died in Newbury on 26 Feb 1640.⁴⁶
- viii. **Elizabeth Chase**, born on 13 Sep 1657.⁴⁷ She married Zachariah Ayer, at Andover, Mass. on 27 Jun 1678.⁴⁸ He was born in Haverhill, Mass. on 24 Oct 1650, the son of John and Sarah (Williams) Ayer.⁴⁹ Zachariah and Elizabeth were both living on 27 Oct 1696.⁵⁰
- ix. **Ruth Chase** was born on 18 Mar 1659/60⁵¹ and died in Newbury on 30 May 1676, unmarried⁵²
- x. **Daniel Chase**, born on 15 Nov 1661 or 9 Dec 1661.⁵³ He married Martha Kimball in Newbury on 25 Aug 1683.⁵⁴ She was born in Wenham, Mass. on 18 Aug 1664, the daughter of Henry and Mary (Wyatt) Kimball.⁵⁵ Daniel died in Newbury 8 Feb 1706/07.⁵⁶ Martha was living in 1713.⁵⁷
- xi. Ensign MOSES² CHASE, born on 24 Dec 1663,⁵⁸ *q. v.*

Thomas¹ Chase (d. 1652) and Elizabeth (Philbrick) Chase (d. 1677)

THOMAS¹ CHASE was born in England. He was the brother of AQUILA¹ CHASE.⁵⁹

Thomas Chase may have been in Hampton, N. H. as early as 1639.⁶⁰ He was certainly there by 1640, when he received a grant of a house lot.⁶¹

ELIZABETH² PHILBRICK (THOMAS¹) was born in England.⁶²

Thomas Chase married Elizabeth Philbrick about 1642.⁶³

Thomas Chase died in Hampton before 5 Oct 1652, for his widow was granted administration of his estate on that date.⁶⁴ His inventory, taken 14 Jun 1653, totaled £111.18s.10d.⁶⁵

Elizabeth Chase married, as her second husband, John Garland, on 26 Oct 1654.⁶⁶ He died in Hampton on 4 Jan 1672, aged 50.⁶⁷ She married HENRY ROBIE (*q. v.*) of Hampton as her third husband, on 19 Jan 1673/74.⁶⁸

Elizabeth (Philbrick) (Chase) (Garland) Robie died in Hampton on 11 Feb 1677.⁶⁹

Thomas and Elizabeth (Philbrick) Chase had the following children, all born in Hampton:

- i. **Thomas Chase**, born in 1643,⁷⁰ died in Hampton on 23 Oct 1714, unmarried⁷¹ estate was granted on 7 Mar 1703/04.⁷⁹ Elizabeth married (2) Joseph Cass of Hampton.⁸⁰
- ii. **Joseph Chase**, born in 1645.⁷² He married Rachel Partridge in Hampton on 31 Dec 1671.⁷³ She was the daughter of WILLIAM and ANN PARTRIDGE, *q. v.* He died in Hampton on 12 Jan 1717/18.⁷⁴ She died there on 27 Oct 1718.⁷⁵
- iii. **James Chase**, born in 1649.⁷⁶ He married Elizabeth Green on 2 Nov 1675 in Hampton.⁷⁷ She was born in Hampton on 11 Jun 1656, the daughter of Henry and Mary Green of Hampton.⁷⁸ Administration on his
- iv. Lieutenant ISAAC² CHASE, born in Hampton on 1 Apr 1650, *q. v.*
- v. **Abraham Chase**, born in Hampton on 6 Aug 1652.⁸¹ He was slain in King Philip's War in 1676 in Marlborough while serving as part of a Hampton contingent sent there.⁸² He died unmarried, and his estate was divided between his brothers Thomas, Joseph, James, and Isaac Chase.⁸³

Moses² Chase (1663-1743) and Ann (Follinsby) Chase (c1668-1708)

MOSES² CHASE (AQUILA¹) was born on 24 Dec 1663 in Newbury, Mass.,⁸⁴ where he lived his entire life, nearly 80 years, earning his living as a weaver.⁸⁵

ANN² FOLLINSBY (THOMAS¹) was born about 1668, probably in Portsmouth, N. H.⁸⁶

Moses Chase married Ann Follinsby on 10 Nov 1684 in Newbury.⁸⁷

In 1689, Moses and Ann Chase settled in the "Upper Woods" section of Newbury, an area that is now within the town of West Newbury, building a house on the Haverhill road. The house he built there in 1689 was still standing, with several later additions, in 1927. Moses lived there until his death.⁸⁸

Throughout his adulthood in Newbury, Moses Chase appears numerous times in the records as a party to land transactions and as an appointee to minor governmental posts.⁸⁹ He acquired a large amount of land, both in the Newbury area and in Sutton, Mass., a new settlement about 10 miles southeast of Worcester, Mass.

Ann Chase died on 18 Apr 1708, 13 days after the birth of her ninth child, a son named Benoni, a Biblical name meaning "child of sorrow."⁹⁰ Ann was buried in the Plains Cemetery in Newbury; her stone was still legible in 1928.⁹¹

Moses Chase served in the militia as an Ensign in a company of snowshoe men. [Chase and Chamberlain, 46] Snowshoe men were militiamen who were trained and equipped for fighting in winter conditions. These companies were established to defend the colony against possible winter raids by the French.

Chase Family

About five years after Ann's death, Moses Chase remarried. His new wife was Sarah Jacobs, daughter of Thomas and Sarah (Brown) Jacobs.⁹² She was born in Ipswich, Mass. on 26 Sep 1674.⁹³

Sarah Chase died in Newbury on 13 Mar 1739, aged 62.⁹⁴

Moses Chase of Newbury wrote his will on 3 July 1740. He mentions his sons Daniel, Joseph, Samuel, Stephen, Benoni, and Moses; his daughters Elizabeth and Hannah; and his grandson Seth Chase.⁹⁵

Ensign Moses Chase died in Newbury 6 Sep 1743.⁹⁶ His will was proved 19 Sep 1743 and his estate inventoried on 23 Sep 1743.⁹⁷

Moses and Sarah Chase were buried in the of Ferry Lane Cemetery (now the Bridge Street Cemetery in West Newbury) where as of 1928 their tombstones were still readable.⁹⁸

Moses and Ann (Follinsby) Chase had the following children, all born in Newbury:

- i. **Moses Chase**, twin born on 20 Sep 1685.⁹⁹ He died before the birth of his brother Moses on 20 Jan 1687/88.
- ii. **Daniel Chase**, twin born on 20 Sep 1685.¹⁰⁰ He married Sarah March in Newbury on 2 Jan 1706.¹⁰¹ She was born in Newbury on 6 Jul 1685, the daughter of George and Mary (Folsom) March.¹⁰² They moved to Littleton, Mass. about 1726, then to Sutton, Mass., about 1733, where he practiced his trade as a cooper.¹⁰³ Daniel died in Sutton on 28 May 1769¹⁰⁴ and Sarah died on 17 Dec 1771.¹⁰⁵ They are buried in the Armory Cemetery in Millbury, Mass.¹⁰⁶
- iii. **MOSES³ CHASE**, born on 20 Jan 1687/88,¹⁰⁷ *q. v.*
- iv. **Samuel Chase**, born on 13 May 1690.¹⁰⁸ He married Hannah Emery in Newbury on 8 Dec 1713.¹⁰⁹ She was born in Newbury about 1695, the son of John³ (John¹⁻²) and Mary (Sawyer) Emery.¹¹⁰ Samuel died from a fall from a horse in Newbury on 24 Jul 1743.¹¹¹ At about the age of 67, after nearly 20 years as a widow, with all her children grown, Hannah (Emery) Chase married (2) as his third wife, James Shute, intention announced 30 Oct 1762.¹¹² He widowed her for the second time on 31 Jan 1769.¹¹³ Hannah died on 6 Oct 1776, aged 81 years.¹¹⁴
- v. **Elizabeth Chase**, born on 2 Sep 1693.¹¹⁵ She married John Carr in Newbury on 14 Dec 1708.¹¹⁶ He was born in Newbury 26 Aug 1684, the son of James and Mary (Sears) Carr.¹¹⁷ He died in Newbury on 5 May 1753;¹¹⁸ she died there on 4 Apr 1764.¹¹⁹
- vi. **Stephen Chase**, born on 29 Aug 1696 or 1697.¹²⁰ He married (1) Sarah Hale on 17 Dec 1717.¹²¹ About 1748 they joined a group of Newbury families moving to Nottingham West, N. H.¹²² He married (2) Thankful ____.¹²³ He died in Nottingham West on 14 Jun 1756.¹²⁴
- vii. **Hannah Chase**, born on 13 Sep 1699.¹²⁵ She married Green Whittier before 1720.¹²⁶ He was born in Haverhill on 13 Mar 1696/97, the son of Joseph and Mary (Peaslee) Whittier.¹²⁷ Hannah was living when her father made his will in 1740. Green died in December 1764.¹²⁸
- viii. **Joseph Chase**, born on 9 Sep 1705.¹²⁹ He married Mary Morse in Newbury on 7 Sep 1724.¹³⁰ She was born in Newbury on 18 May 1704, the daughter of Anthony and Sarah (Pike) Morse.¹³¹ He died in Newbury on 27 Nov 1782;¹³² she died there on 8 Mar or 18 Mar 1787.¹³³
- ix. **Benoni Chase**, born on 5 Apr 1708.¹³⁴ He married Mary Rogers in Newbury on 4 Sep 1728.¹³⁵ Mary Rogers was born in Newbury on 23 Jun 1708, the daughter of Thomas and Hannah (Long) Rogers.¹³⁶ They lived in Sutton, Mass., from about 1730 to 1768, then moved to Douglas, Mass. They remained there for several years, then moved to New York State.¹³⁷ She died on 29 Feb 1788;¹³⁸ he died July 4 of the same year.¹³⁹

Isaac² Chase (1650-1727) and Mary (Tilton) Chase (d. 1746)

ISAAC² CHASE (THOMAS¹) was born on 1 Apr 1650 in Hampton, N. H..¹⁴⁰ He became a Quaker.¹⁴¹

Isaac Chase married Mary Perkins on 20 Feb 1673 in Hampton.¹⁴² She was the daughter of Isaac and Susanna Perkins, born in Hampton 23 Jun 1658.¹⁴³ She died very soon, perhaps in childbirth, although there are no children recorded for her.¹⁴⁴

Isaac Chase moved to Tisbury, on Martha's Vineyard, in 1674.¹⁴⁵ He was not made welcome, probably because of his Quaker views:

The townsmen of Tysbury do not give unto isack chace of Hampton liberty to settle in the town.¹⁴⁶

Like many other Seventeenth Century New England Quakers, Isaac Chase was not easily dissuaded; he settled in Tisbury anyway and lived there for the rest of his life.

Isaac Chase married MARY TILTON on 5 Dec 1675 in Tisbury.¹⁴⁷

Isaac Chase made his will on 12 Feb 1721/22. In it he mentions his wife Mary; his daughters Rachel Knight, Mary Weeks, Hannah Pease, Sarah Cobb, and Priscilla Folger; his sons Abraham, James, Joseph, and Jonathan Chase; his grandchildren Thomas and Sarah Chase, children of his son Thomas Chase, deceased; and six grandchildren, unnamed, children of his son Isaac Chase, deceased.¹⁴⁸

Isaac Chase died in Tisbury on 19 May 1727.¹⁴⁹ His will was proved on 7 Jul 1727.¹⁵⁰

Mary Chase died in Tisbury on 14 Jun 1746, in her 88th year.¹⁵¹

Isaac and Mary (Tilton) Chase had the following children, all born in Tisbury:

- i. **Thomas Chase**, born on 9 Nov 1677.¹⁵² He married Jane Smith in Edgartown, Mass. on 21 Feb 1704.¹⁵³ She was born about 1685, the daughter of Benjamin and Jedidah (Mayhew) Smith.¹⁵⁴ Thomas Chase died on 22 Dec 1721.¹⁵⁵ Jane married (2) Thomas Cathcart, in Tisbury on 15 May 1724.¹⁵⁶
- ii. **RACHEL³ CHASE**, born on 25 Oct 1679.¹⁵⁷ She married (1) SAMUEL KNIGHT of Charlestown and Sudbury, *q. v.*
- iii. **Isaac Chase**, born on 21 Jan 1681/82.¹⁵⁸ He lived in Chilmark, Mass., where he was a mariner and a blacksmith.¹⁵⁹ He married Mary Pease on 3 Oct 1702.¹⁶⁰ She was the daughter of James and Elizabeth (Norton) Pease, born about 1680.¹⁶¹ He died at sea on 13 Oct 1716.¹⁶² Mary married (2) Richard Crookes, in Chilmark on 9 Jul 1720.¹⁶³
- iv. **Abraham Chase**, born on 10 Jan 1683/84.¹⁶⁴ He was a ferryman, innholder, and trader.¹⁶⁵ He married (1) Abigail Barnard.¹⁶⁶ She was the daughter of Nathaniel and Mary (Barnard) Barnard of Nantucket.¹⁶⁷ Abigail died in Tisbury on 15 Oct 1731, aged 46 years.¹⁶⁸ Abraham married (2) Mercy Nickerson of Falmouth in Falmouth on 5 Mar 1732.¹⁶⁹ She was born about 1709, the daughter of Nathaniel and Katherine (Stewart) Nickerson.¹⁷⁰ Abraham died on 20 Dec 1763.¹⁷¹ Mercy married (2) Thomas Winston¹⁷² and died as his widow on 11 Sep 1786 in her 77th year.¹⁷³
- v. **James Chase**, born on 15 Jan 1685/86.¹⁷⁴ He married Rachel Browne about 1708.¹⁷⁵ She was the daughter of John and Rachel (Gardner) Brown, born on 14 Dec 1687.¹⁷⁶ They lived on Nantucket where he died in 1728 or 1729¹⁷⁷ and she died on 24 Sep 1741.¹⁷⁸
- vi. **Mary Chase**, born on 17 Jan 1687/88.¹⁷⁹ She married Benjamin Weeks of Falmouth, Mass. on 14 Jan 1704.¹⁸⁰
- vii. **Joseph Chase**, born on 26 Feb 1689.¹⁸¹ He married Lydia Coffin on 16 Sep 1714 on Nantucket.¹⁸² She was the daughter of Nathaniel and Damaris (Gayer) Coffin, born on Nantucket on 16 May 1697.¹⁸³ He died in Edgartown on 1 May 1749.¹⁸⁴ She died there on 17 Jul 1749.¹⁸⁵
- viii. **Jonathan Chase**, born on 28 Dec 1691.¹⁸⁶ He was a vintner.¹⁸⁷ He married Mehitable _____ about 1710.¹⁸⁸ He died in Newport, R. I. on 20 Jul 1742 or

Mary Tilton's approximate birth date calculated from her gravestone age of 88 years at her death in 1746 would have her born about 1654; however, this makes her 49 when her last child was born, so it is likely that her age at death was overstated by a few years. Chase and Chamberlain, 482, say that she was the daughter of William¹ Tilton, but Davis, Massachusetts and Maine Families, 3:455, argues that this is improbable; she would necessarily have to have been born by 1653 (when William Tilton died), which would make her 50 at the birth of her last child. Davis speculated that she was probably an illegitimate daughter of Samuel² (William¹) Tilton by a liaison that occurred before his marriage.

Moses³ Chase (1688-1760) and Elizabeth (Wells) Chase (1688-1755)

MOSES³ CHASE (MOSES² AQUILA¹) was born on 20 Jan 1687/88 in Newbury, Mass.²⁰⁰

ELIZABETH³ WELLS (THOMAS¹⁻²) was born in on 17 Dec 1688 in Amesbury, Mass.²⁰¹

Moses Chase married Elizabeth Wells in Amesbury on 12 Oct 1709.²⁰²

Elizabeth Chase died in Newbury on 31 May 1755.²⁰³

Moses Chase made his will on 24 Nov 1757, in which he mentions his sons Wells, Seth, Humphrey, Eleazer, Moses, and Daniel, and his daughter Elizabeth Bailey.²⁰⁴

Moses Chase died in Newbury on 17 Sep 1760.²⁰⁵ His will was proved on 6 Oct 1760.²⁰⁶

Moses and Elizabeth Chase are both buried in the Bridge Street Cemetery in what is now West Newbury.²⁰⁷

Moses and Elizabeth (Wells) Chase had the following children, all born in Newbury:

H. on 2 Dec 1785.²¹³
- ii. **Moses Chase**, born on 1 Jul 1713.²¹⁴ He married Judith Bartlett on 9 Dec 1736 in Newbury.²¹⁵ She was the daughter of [RICHARD AND MARGARET \(WOODMAN\) BARTLETT](#), *q. v.* Judith Chase died in Newbury on 18 Feb 1783.²¹⁶ Moses Chase died there 9 Oct 1789.²¹⁷

Seth⁴ Chase (1715-1791) and Elizabeth (Bartlett) Chase (1714-1787)

SETH⁴ CHASE (MOSES²⁻³ AQUILA¹) was born on 1 Jul 1713 in Newbury, Mass.²⁴⁷

[ELIZABETH⁵ BARTLETT \(RICHARD¹⁻⁴\)](#) was born on 5 Mar 1787 in Newbury.²⁴⁸

Seth Chase married Elizabeth Bartlett in Newbury on 31 May 1738.²⁴⁹

In 1743, Seth Chase received a grant of 130 acres of land in Sutton, Mass., in his grandfather Moses Chase's will "as a reward for the faithful service Done for me in my age."²⁵⁰ He and Elizabeth moved to Sutton, where they remained for the rest of their lives, and where Seth was a comb-maker.²⁵¹ Seth's uncle Benoni, also a beneficiary of land in Sutton from his father Moses' will, also lived in Sutton.²⁵² In Sutton, Seth Chase became a deacon of the Baptist church.²⁵³

Seth Chase, then in his 60's, served as a private in the Massachusetts militia during the American Revolution.²⁵⁴

Elizabeth Chase died in Sutton on 22 May 1787.²⁵⁵ Seventy-two year old Seth Chase took as his second wife the thrice-widowed 70-year-old Abigail March²⁵⁶ on 17 Mar 1788 in Sutton.²⁵⁷ Abigail was born on 29 Sep 1718, supposedly the first white child born in Sutton.²⁵⁸

Seth Chase died in Sutton on 24 Sep 1791,²⁵⁹ making Abigail a widow for the fourth time. His will was probated in Worcester later that year.²⁶⁰

Seth is buried beside his first wife, Elizabeth Chase, in Dodge Cemetery in Sutton.²⁶¹

Bradford Chase married Abigail Sibley in Sutton on 21 Jun 1763.²⁹¹ They lived in Sutton on his father's homestead.²⁹²

Bradford Chase died in Sutton on 12 Jul 1783, not yet 42 years old.²⁹³ Abigail married (2) Nathaniel Cooper of Northbridge, Mass., in Sutton on 31 Oct 1790.²⁹⁴ Nathaniel died in Northbridge on 16 Jul 1821.²⁹⁵ Abigail died on 3 Feb 1824.²⁹⁶

Peter Chase was a preacher.³²⁹

ABIGAIL GREEN⁶ HAPGOOD (JOSEPH³⁻⁵ THOMAS² SHADRACH¹) was born in Marlborough, Mass. on 12 Feb 1816.³⁷⁶

On 1 Mar 1835, Leonard Chase was living in Grafton, Mass., when he and Abigail Hapgood of Sutton, Mass. published in Sutton their intention to marry.³⁷⁷ Leonard Chase married Abigail Hapgood on 9 Apr 1835.³⁷⁸

Leonard Chase died before 19 Aug 1845, for on that date the widow Abigail Chase took as her second husband Luther Whitaker, in West Boylston, Mass.³⁷⁹ He was a farmer of West Boylston.³⁸⁰ Leonard and Abigail Whitaker had four children.³⁸¹

Abigail (Hapgood) (Chase) Whitaker died in Hudson, Mass. on 22 Jun 1890.³⁸²

Hiram Chase married Harriet Brigham on 2 Jun 1864.³⁸⁸

Hiram Chase was a businessman in Hudson, Mass. In 1871, he and a partner established a stage route between Hudson and Clinton, Mass.³⁸⁹ About 1880, he erected a brick block of stores in Wood Square in Hudson, in which he operated a market. This block was destroyed by a fire in 1894, a conflagration that wiped out most of downtown Hudson. He built a new structure on the same site. In 1935, long after his death, this structure also burned down.³⁹⁰

Hiram Chase died in Hudson on 23 Mar 1898.³⁹¹ Harriet Chase died in 1928 in Everett, Mass.³⁹²
